ECO-ART PROJECT: PLASTIC BOTTLE NOISEMAKERS

Making noisemakers from the plastic bottles is a fun way to reuse and repurpose both recyclables and other items that you find around the house.

What You'll Need:

- A plastic bottle for each student
- 100-200 buttons, paper clips, pennies, etc.
- Construction paper
- Glue
- Glitter (optional)
- Craft paint (optional)



What to Do:

- Encourage your students to bring in assorted buttons, paper clips, pennies and any other small "noise-making" items of your choosing from home.
- 2. Provide each student with one plastic bottle to work with and encourage them to decorate it with colorful construction paper and for some extra sparkle, use glitter!
 - Another creative way that students can add to their noisemakers is by using craft paint to style the plastic bottle caps with fun colors.
- 3. Once the bottles are finished and have dried, ask students to fill them with an assortment of the items brought in from home.
- 4. Seal the bottles with their original, painted caps and you have yourself a noisemaker made from recyclables!
- 5. Use your noisemaker in real life: students can use their final projects in music class, during assemblies when they cheer for classmates, or to make some noise (literally) during recycling events and drives at school!
